GOALS AND AIM

By the end of the course, you'll be able to:

- Think deeper about interconnected problems
- Demonstrate an understanding of climate change and its consequences related to migration, as well as get to know global education approach to learning and education
- Learn about cases of climate migration
- Understand open questions and dilemmas connected to the (lack of) climate migration definitions
- Explain to your colleagues and peers the critical importance of global education approaches in creating a fully inclusive educational learning environment
- Identify and engage with the distinct legacies of colonialism and capitalism
- Identify and assess appropriate actions and approaches that would be effective in developing sustainable educational practices in your own educational and/or activistic setting
- Design and lead an interview process in an intercultural environment that includes peers from Uganda, Myanmar, Bolivia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Spain
- Co-create stories connected to climate driven migration from Uganda, Myanmar, Bolivia, BiH and Spain that will be published in a printed booklet
- Meet interesting people and hear interesting stories from around the world

MODULES

The course consists of three modules, spanning for six weeks in total. Each module has several lectures. Each two weeks you will receive an update on the next module, but here you can already read a short description of each module:

Module 1 - Climate driven migration

22 Februar - 8 March

The first two weeks will offer you an insight into the climate crisis, which will help you better understand the main causes of climate migration. Firstly, you will be given an overview of causes and effects of climate change, after which you will discuss the inequalities associated with it. Later on you will be invited to dive deeper into the topic of climate migration and to learn more about the hotspot regions around the world, which are currently among the most affected by climate change (Palestine, Myanmar and Bangladesh, Bolivia, Uganda, Sahel region, Pacific region).

Module 2 - Decolonizing knowledge through global learning 9 - 23 March

In the second module we will dive into global learning, a transformative and life-long and life-wide learning method, enabling us to (un)learn and shift some perspectives of our knowledge of the world. Through the prism of global learning and its methodologies we will rethink the roots and consequences of global inequalities, critically overview generally accepted and rarely questioned single stories of progress, epistemology and power relations, and challenge some representations of the Global South, thus preparing us to be better observers, commenters and changers of the world.

Module 3 - Changing perspectives

23 March - 6 April

Changing Perspectives is a module created by youth and based on their perspectives regarding themes of poverty, climate crisis and migration, and its effect on young people. Firstly, you will be given an overview of the planet and people over profit, after which you will discuss and answer the questions associated with it. Later on, you will be invited to dive deeper into the topics of power, agency, and climate change. Furthermore, the third lesson will guide you into the world of the damaging effects of the inequalities of the Global North/South on the environment and its impact on migrations. Lastly, you will learn what are the effects that climate change has on youth and get an overview of the case studies of youth recorded in their respective countries.

THE DISCUSSION FORUM

In some lectures you will encounter questions that you can discuss together with your colleagues via Google groups (invitation will be sent to you separately). You can also use google groups to introduce yourself to the other participants.

ASSESMENT AND CERTIFICATE
